TOPICS COVERED IN SESSION:

This training covers immigrants' rights to health care and sources of affordable care, provides an overview of immigrant eligibility for public health insurance programs in NYS, and addresses immigrant family concerns such as public charge, sponsor liability, sponsoring of family members, and repayment of benefits. The session is appropriate for health providers, immigrant advocates, facilitated enrollers, case managers, social workers, and immigration attorneys. Given the latest debates and interest in health care reform and universal coverage, this training gives good grounding on immigrants' current eligibility for public insurance and financial assistance, and opportunities for affordable care within today's health care context.

This training will be conducted by Maysoun Freij of the NYIC staff. No CLE Credit is offered for this training.
