

The **Bruce E. Friedman Pro Bono Award,** sponsored by the New Hampshire Bar Association and the UNH School of Law Social Justice Institute, honors the accomplishments of a UNH School of Law graduate, and NH Bar member, who exemplifies the commitment to public service of Bruce E. Friedman, the late founder of the civil practice clinic at the law school and a legend in the world of civil legal services in New Hampshire.

The **Frank Rowe Kenison Lecture Series** honors Judge Frank Rowe Kenison who served as Chief Justice of the New Hampshire Supreme Court from 1952 to 1977. The series was established in 1980 to highlight the role of state court judges and the importance of the state court jurisprudence on the legal landscape.

This inaugural **Norman H. Stahl Lecture Series** honors Norman H. Stahl, who was appointed to the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit in 1992. He assumed senior status in 2001, but continues to sit on cases today. The lecture series was established to highlight innovations by court systems and legal service providers that increase access to justice and address the rise in unmet legal needs.
