The Federal Reserve Bank of New York and the City Bar Justice Center have organized a program to provide pro bono legal representation to individuals whose homes are threatened with mortgage foreclosure. We need your help.

Participating lawyers will have the opportunity to serve homeowners in several ways: defend against a mortgage foreclosure action, negotiate with the lender to modify or restructure the loan, file a bankruptcy proceeding, or, where the home cannot be saved, help secure an orderly transition with minimum damage to credit.
