Does Your State Have Automated Online Identity Theft Resources?

The National Identity Theft Victims Assistance Network (NITVAN) - a national network of coalitions around the country - along with partners at Kansas Legal Services and Pro Bono Net, have created & launched an online Access to Justice (A2J) assistance package for victims of identity theft.

The package includes automated creation of letters - mirroring those created by the Federal Trade Commission - which victims can use in communicating and resolving issues with **creditors**, **debt collectors**, **and credit reporting bureaus**. Information about options victims have in recovering from the crime, as well as links to helpful resources are also available. The packages are **available now** in the following states:
